Leslie Lenert, an internationally recognized informatics expert, has been named inaugural director of the Rutgers Center for Biomedical Informatics and Health Artificial Intelligence (BMIHAI), based at IFH.

Lenert joins Rutgers from the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC), where he held positions including distinguished professor of internal medicine, associate vice president of data science and informatics, chief research



information officer and director of the Biomedical Informatics Center. Bringing experience in information technology, artificial intelligence, health policy, and public health administration, Lenert was selected for the position after an extensive national search.




